Venue: Stanford Hall, Stanford Rd, Lutterworth LE17 6DH

Venue: Parking is in the form of fully fenced field, allocated for our use. Note that there are NO are toilets, water or Catering van on the field but toilets are nearby.

Riders can arrive from 9.00am. Once you have parked up and unloaded your horses please make your way to the self check-in at the secretaries' tent, where you will be collect your rider bib and wrist bands.

Ride times are first horse away 9.30am Last horse 11am. Longer distance riders by 10.30am please.

Pleasure Miles: 6, 8 & 11

The route will be marked by painted arrows on the floor, tape in trees and arrows. All Marshalls and helpers have given up there day to ensure you have a pleasurable ride, please thank them when passing through.

THE VENUE IS A COMPULSORY WALK ZONE. DOGS MUST BE KEPT ON A LEAD AT ALL TIMES

RIDE DETAILS:

Situated in the south Leicestershire not far from Lutterworth and the M1 junction 20 and the A5 there will plenty of canter opportunities and mainly all off road using bridle ways and quiet lanes.

For the non riders attending the hall will be open to visit - Ride venue is in the monument field

First Aider

This event does not have an official first aider but there are plenty helpers who are qualified in first aid, a first aid kit will be at the secretary tent.

VENUE TYPE: Field (No hard standing).

FACILITIES: Toilets nearby but no catering or water

NB. ALL LATE BOOKINGS NOT ON THE BIB NUMBERS LIST MUST BRING A PRINTED COPY OF THEIR BOOKING CONFIRMATION TO GIVE TO THE SECRETARY

No SPURS or Whips longer than 30" as per our rules.

Standing Martingale are also not permitted without written approval prior to the ride

Hats must be secured by chin strap and meet current standard

Head Cameras may be used but are not recommended as may alter the safety of the hat (they are safer on arm, leg or body)

All riders should take time to read through our rules – these can be found on our website.

Never pass another horse without asking permission first, always pass at a pace no more than trot. Remember that not everyone may be a confident rider or they may have a novice horse; please see below tail ribbons for guidance.

TAIL RIBBONS

Please wear the follow ribbons in your horse's tail if needed.

RED RIBBON - My horse may kick

GREEN RIBBON – I or my horse are nervous /novice, approach with caution and pass with care BLUE RIBBON – My horse is a stallion

Please take litter home with you and do not muck trailers / boxes out at venue
